# A PhD position or a post-Doc position in Human Geography / Geographies of Education

(PhD 4 years, 60%; post-doc position for ca. 3.5 years, 60-65%, SNF salary categories)

The successful applicant will be part of the SNF-research project on the topic **Young people's transition to Gymnasium and the role of private and public supplementary learning programs** led by Sara Landolt and Itta Bauer.

This project focuses on educational transitions to Gymnasium at the crossroads of increasing marketization of education and equality of opportunity through a case study in the City of Zurich. Drawing on qualitative methods, the research team will study the actors in this highly competitive educational environment, which is experiencing an unprecedented boom involving the learning programs of schools, profit-oriented private supplementary learning providers, and private non-profit initiatives. The target groups of our research in Zurich are young people at the two thresholds to Gymnasium and their parents, representatives of educational institutions and politics, private entrepreneurs, and people running nonprofit initiatives. We take a particular interest in the perspectives and experiences of young people (12-16 ys.) in this field.

# Your responsibilities

We are looking for a candidate who seeks to pursue a PhD in the context of this research project. Each team member will be responsible for his/her own distinct work package entailing a number of ethnographic case studies. The empirical data gathered within the team will contribute to a shared data base. Applicants with an interest in critical social theories (including children's and young people's geographies, youth studies, feminist, post-colonial and social justice perspectives) are particularly encouraged to apply.

Your main tasks include designing and realizing your own PhD project, contributing to our teaching program and participating in our regular research-related team activities, as well as carrying out limited administrative duties.

# Your profile

Applicants are expected to hold an excellent master's degree in human geography, social or educational studies or any other relevant discipline. You have already some experience in qualitative research methods. We expect high ambitions for presenting and publishing internationally. Consequently, proficiency in German and English is an essential requirement.

#### What we offer

We offer a stimulating and supportive work environment that provides plenty of opportunities to develop an academic career. As a PhD student, you will join the Graduate School of the Department of Geography which offers you great opportunities to interact and exchange with other PhD students. Diversity and inclusion are important and matter to us.

The position is for four years. The salary is commensurate with the regulations of the Swiss National Science Foundation. Funding for project-related fieldwork and conference visits are available.

## Your responsibilities
